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Original

The Terms and Conditions listed below are incorporated by reference and made a part of this Contract. Unless otherwise limited in this Contract, each document applies in its entirety.

In the event of a conflict between the version or date of a clause set forth in this document and the version or date of a clause set forth in the identified CorpDocs, the version or date of the clauses set forth in this document shall take precedence.

To the extent that any clause included in this PSFD is inapplicable to the performance of this Contract, the parties shall consider such clauses to be self-deleting and shall not impose any obligations upon the SELLER.

1. The following FAR, DFARS, and NAVAIR clauses are added:

DFARS 252.211-7007 Reporting of Government-Furnished Equipment in the DoD Item Unique Identification (IUID) Registry (NOV 2008) (Applies if Seller will be in possession of Government property for the performance of this contract).

DFARS 252.211-7008 Use of Government-Assigned Serial Numbers (SEP 2010) (Applies if Seller will be in possession of Government property for the performance of this contract).

DFARS 252.223-7006 Prohibition on Storage and Disposal of Toxic and Hazardous Materials (APR 2012) ("Government" means "Lockheed Martin and Government." Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101).

DFARS 252.228-7001 Ground and Flight Risk (JUN 2010) (In paragraph (a)(1)(i) "this contract" means "the prime contract." The following is added at the beginning of the clause: "Communications between Seller and the Government shall be made through Lockheed Martin. Any equitable adjustment provided for this clause shall be implemented in this contract to the extent such adjustment is implemented in the prime contract." Subparagraphs (d)(2)(ii), (d)(3)(ii) and the last sentence of subparagraph (j)(2) are deleted.) (Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101).

FAR 52.215-14 ALT I Alternate I - Integrity of Unit Prices (OCT 1997) (Applies if this contract exceeds the simplified acquisition threshold. Paragraph (b) is deleted.) (Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101).

FAR 52.215-21 ALT II Alternate II - Requirements for Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Cost or Pricing Data-Modifications (OCT 2012) ("Contracting Officer" means "Lockheed Martin" in paragraphs (a)(1) and (b)).

FAR 52.232-17 Interest (OCT 2010) ("Government" means "Lockheed Martin.") (Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101).

FAR 52.245-9 Use and Charges (APR 2012) (Communications with the Government under this clause will be made through Lockheed Martin.) (Applies if Seller will be in possession of Government property for the performance of this contract).

52.232-32 PERFORMANCE-BASED PAYMENTS (APR 2012) (Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101), ("Contracting Officer" and "Government" means "Lockheed Martin" except with respect to title for property where the references to the Government shall be unchanged. (Subparagraph (c)(2) is deleted).

252.211-7003 ITEM IDENTIFICATION AND VALUATION (JUN 2011) (Applicable if this Contract requires the Work to contain unique item identification. In (c)(3)(i), (c)(4)(i), (d), (e), and (f) "Contractor" shall mean "Subcontractor"; all reports required to be submitted under this clause shall be submitted to Lockheed Martin at a location to be provided; delete paragraph (g) and insert the following in lieu



thereof: (g) Lower-Tier Subcontracts. Seller shall include this clause, including this paragraph (g), in all lower tier subcontracts issued under this Subcontract for the acquisition of components identified herein as requiring UID).

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause--

"Automatic identification device" means a device, such as a reader or interrogator, used to retrieve data encoded on machine-readable media.

"Concatenated unique item identifier" means--

- (1) For items that are serialized within the enterprise identifier, the linking together of the unique identifier data elements in order of the issuing agency code, enterprise identifier, and unique serial number within the enterprise identifier; or
- (2) For items that are serialized within the original part, lot, or batch number, the linking together of the unique identifier data elements in order of the issuing agency code; enterprise identifier; original part, lot, or batch number; and serial number within the original part, lot, or batch number.
- "Data qualifier" means a specified character (or string of characters) that immediately precedes a data field that defines the general category or intended use of the data that follows.
- "DoD recognized unique identification equivalent" means a unique identification method that is in commercial use and has been recognized by DoD. All DoD recognized unique identification equivalents are listed at IUID Equivalents.
- "DoD unique item identification" means a system of marking items delivered to DoD with unique item identifiers that have machine-readable data elements to distinguish an item from all other like and unlike items. For items that are serialized within the enterprise identifier, the unique item identifier shall include the data elements of the enterprise identifier and a unique serial number. For items that are serialized within the part, lot, or batch number within the enterprise identifier, the unique item identifier shall include the data elements of the enterprise identifier; the original part, lot, or batch number; and the serial number.

"Enterprise" means the entity (e.g., a manufacturer or vendor) responsible for assigning unique item identifiers to items.

"Enterprise identifier" means a code that is uniquely assigned to an enterprise by an issuing agency.

"Government's unit acquisition cost" means—

- (1) For fixed-price type line, subline, or exhibit line items, the unit price identified in the contract at the time of delivery;
- (2) For cost-type or undefinitized line, subline, or exhibit line items, the Contractor's estimated fully burdened unit cost to the Government at the time of delivery; and
- (3) For items produced under a time-and-materials contract, the Contractor's estimated fully burdened unit cost to the Government at the time of delivery.



"Issuing agency" means an organization responsible for assigning a globally unique identifier to an enterprise (e.g., Dun & Bradstreet's Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) Number, GS1 Company Prefix, Allied Committee 135 NATO Commercial and Government Entity (NCAGE)/Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) Code, or the Coded Representation of the North American Telecommunications Industry Manufacturers, Suppliers, and Related Service Companies (ATIS-0322000) Number), European Health Industry Business Communication Council (EHIBCC) and Health Industry Business Communication Council (HIBCC)), as indicated in the Register of Issuing Agency Codes for ISO/IEC 15459, located at http://www.nen.nl/web/Normen-ontwikkelen/ISOIEC-15459-Issuing-Agency-Codes.htm .

"Issuing agency code" means a code that designates the registration (or controlling) authority for the enterprise identifier.

"Item" means a single hardware article or a single unit formed by a grouping of subassemblies, components, or constituent parts, usually referred to as either a lot or a batch, all of which were manufactured under identical conditions.

"Machine-readable" means an automatic identification technology media, such as bar codes, contact memory buttons, radio frequency identification, or optical memory cards.

"Original part number" means a combination of numbers or letters assigned by the enterprise at item creation to a class of items with the same form, fit, function, and interface.

"Parent item" means the item assembly, intermediate component, or subassembly that has an embedded item with a unique item identifier or DoD recognized unique identification equivalent.

"Serial number within the enterprise identifier" means a combination of numbers, letters, or symbols assigned by the enterprise to an item that provides for the differentiation of that item from any other like and unlike item and is never used again within the enterprise.

"Serial number within the part, lot, or batch number" means a combination of numbers or letters assigned by the enterprise to an item that provides for the differentiation of that item from any other like item within a part, lot, or batch number assignment.

"Serialization within the enterprise identifier" means each item produced is assigned a serial number that is unique among all the tangible items produced by the enterprise and is never used again. The enterprise is responsible for ensuring unique serialization within the enterprise identifier.

"Serialization within the part, lot, or batch number" means each item of a particular part, lot, or batch number is assigned a unique serial number within that part, lot, or batch number assignment. The enterprise is responsible for ensuring unique serialization within the part, lot, or batch number within the enterprise identifier.

"Unique item identifier" means a set of data elements marked on items that is globally unique and unambiguous. The term includes a concatenated unique item identifier or a DoD recognized unique identification equivalent.



"Unique item identifier type" means a designator to indicate which method of uniquely identifying a part has been used. The current list of accepted unique item identifier types is maintained at UII Types.

- (b) The Contractor shall deliver all items under a contract line, subline, or exhibit line item.
- (c) Unique item identifier.
- (1) The Contractor shall provide a unique item identifier for the following:
- (i) All delivered items for which the Government's unit acquisition cost is \$5,000 or more.
- (ii) The following items for which the Government's unit acquisition cost is less than \$5,000:

- (iii) Subassemblies, components, and parts embedded within delivered items as specified in Attachment Number ----.
- (2) The unique item identifier and the component data elements of the DoD unique item identification shall not change over the life of the item.
- (3) Data syntax and semantics of unique item identifiers. The Contractor shall ensure that--
- (i) The encoded data elements (except issuing agency code) of the unique item identifier are marked on the item using one of the following three types of data qualifiers, as determined by the Contractor:
- (A) Application Identifiers (AIs) (Format Indicator 05 of ISO/IEC International Standard 15434), in accordance with ISO/IEC International Standard 15418, Information Technology--EAN/UCC Application Identifiers and Fact Data Identifiers and Maintenance and ANSI MH 10.8.2 Data Identifier and Application Identifier Standard.
- (B) Data Identifiers (DIs) (Format Indicator 06 of ISO/IEC International Standard 15434), in accordance with ISO/IEC International Standard 15418, Information Technology--EAN/UCC Application Identifiers and Fact Data Identifiers and Maintenance and ANSI MH 10.8.2 Data Identifier and Application Identifier Standard.
- (C) Text Element Identifiers (TEIs) (Format Indicator 12 of ISO/IEC International Standard 15434), in accordance with the Air Transport Association Common Support Data Dictionary; and
- (ii) The encoded data elements of the unique item identifier conform to the transfer structure, syntax, and coding of messages and data formats specified for Format Indicators 05, 06, and 12 in ISO/IEC International Standard 15434, Information Technology--Transfer Syntax for High Capacity Automatic Data Capture Media.
- (4) Unique item identifier.
- (i) The Contractor shall--



- (A) Determine whether to—
- (1) Serialize within the enterprise identifier;
- (2) Serialize within the part, lot, or batch number; or
- (3) Use a DoD recognized unique identification equivalent; and
- (B) Place the data elements of the unique item identifier (enterprise identifier; serial number; DoD recognized unique identification equivalent; and for serialization within the part, lot, or batch number only: original part, lot, or batch number) on items requiring marking by paragraph (c)(1) of this clause, based on the criteria provided in the version of MIL-STD-130, Identification Marking of U.S. Military Property, cited in the contract Schedule.
- (ii) The issuing agency code--
- (A) Shall not be placed on the item; and
- (B) Shall be derived from the data qualifier for the enterprise identifier.
- (d) For each item that requires unique item identification under paragraph (c)(1)(i) or (ii) of this clause, in addition to the information provided as part of the Material Inspection and Receiving Report specified elsewhere in this contract, the Contractor shall report at the time of delivery, either as part of, or associated with, the Material Inspection and Receiving Report, the following information:
- (1) Unique item identifier.
- (2) Unique item identifier type.
- (3) Issuing agency code (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).
- (4) Enterprise identifier (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).
- (5) Original part number (if there is serialization within the original part number).
- (6) Lot or batch number (if there is serialization within the lot or batch number).
- (7) Current part number (optional and only if not the same as the original part number).
- (8) Current part number effective date (optional and only if current part number is used).
- (9) Serial number (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).
- (10) Government's unit acquisition cost.
- (11) Unit of measure.
- (e) For embedded subassemblies, components, and parts that require DoD unique item identification under paragraph (c)(1)(iii) of this clause, the Contractor shall report as part of, or



associated with, the Material Inspection and Receiving Report specified elsewhere in this contract, the following information:

- (1) Unique item identifier of the parent item under paragraph (c)(1) of this clause that contains the embedded subassembly, component, or part.
- (2) Unique item identifier of the embedded subassembly, component, or part.
- (3) Unique item identifier type.**
- (4) Issuing agency code (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).**
- (5) Enterprise identifier (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).**
- (6) Original part number (if there is serialization within the original part number).**
- (7) Lot or batch number (if there is serialization within the lot or batch number).**
- (8) Current part number (optional and only if not the same as the original part number).**
- (9) Current part number effective date (optional and only if current part number is used).**
- (10) Serial number (if concatenated unique item identifier is used).**
- (11) Description.
- ** Once per item.
- (f) The Contractor shall submit the information required by paragraphs (d) and (e) of this clause in accordance with the data submission procedures at Data Submission Info.
- (g) Lower-Tier Subcontracts. Seller shall include this clause, including this paragraph (g), in all lower tier subcontracts issued under this Subcontract for the acquisition of components identified herein as requiring UID).
- **252.227-7017 IDENTIFICATION AND ASSERTION OF USE, RELEASE, OR DISCLOSURE RESTRICTIONS. (JAN 2011)** (Does not apply if contract is for a "Commercial Item" as defined in FAR Part 2.101) ("Offeror" means "Seller." Contracting Officer" means "Lockheed Martin or Contracting Officer." In paragraphs (a) and (b) the references to the SBIR data rights clause are deleted).
